The idea of the Double Violin Concerto arose out of a natural convergence of three of my deepest collaborative relationships: with violinist Colin Jacobsen, violinist-vocalist Carla Kihlstedt and BMOP conductor Gil Rose. It turned out to be a dizzying, joyful celebration of so many aspects of shared music-making with these three friends and muses: multi-part lyrical canons, technical puzzles, gypsy rhythms applied to ancient Gregorian chant melodies, vocalization, extended techniques, improvised implementation of an Ornament Library, dueling embellishments, and metric modulations at warp speed. The text for the Song, which is the guiding spirit of the whole piece, comes from Goethe's Faust:
